

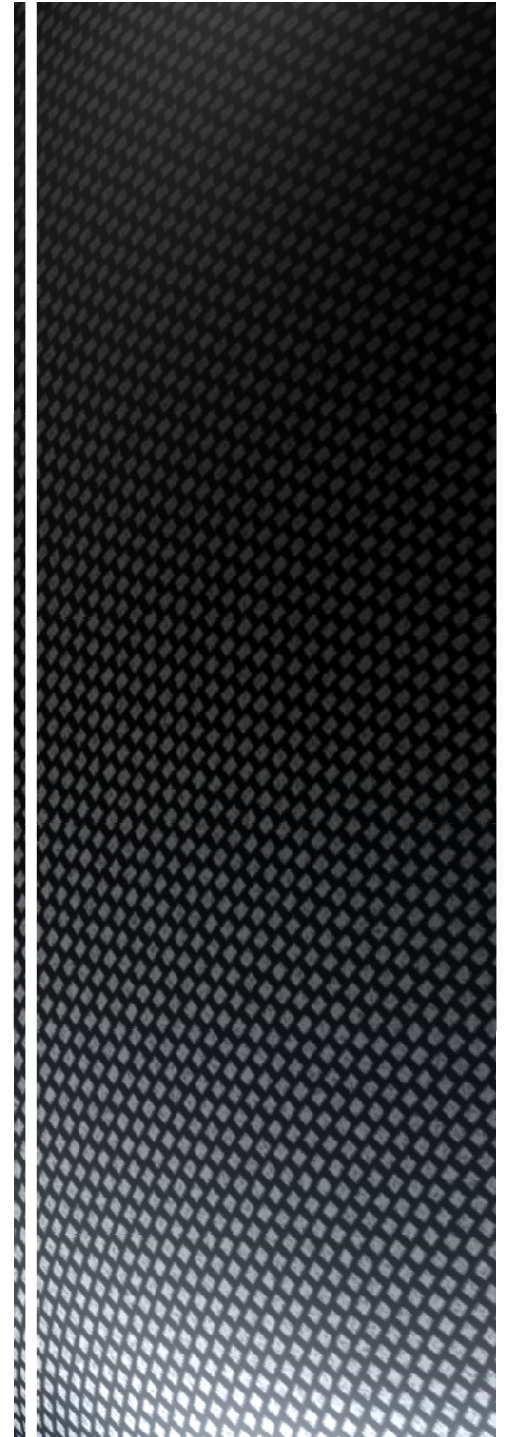

Workshop#1 & Workshop#2

Soda Bottle Rockets & Engineering a Race Car

FACT: Many high-paying STEM jobs go unfilled as candidates lack necessary skills, training or post secondary degrees...

These workshops teach engineering design and will not only introduce students to the joys of STEM but students will also work hands-on with facilitators to design and build model cars and rockets that demonstrate scientific concepts including velocity, force, motion, and Newton's laws of physics, and teaches engineering design.

These Science education products incorporate applied math and science principles into classroom projects to demonstrate STEM concepts and real-world applications through hands-on activities.



Workshop#3

Lights, Camera, Action

This is a hands on workshop presented by the Clark Atlanta University Television Station (CAUTV).

In this workshop, CAU-TV professionals will provide technical guidance and training to TRiO participants so that students will not only learn how to operate cameras and lighting equipment but will learn to use software that manipulates pictures and videos. The end result of the lessons learned will be a video produced by Georgia TRiO students.
